Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Laws Under the Tariff Act of 1930 . Under the Tariff Act of 1930, U.S. industries may petition the government for relief from imports that are sold in the United States at less than fair value ("dumped") or which benefit from subsidies provided through foreign government programs.

### Understanding Antidumping & Countervailing Duty ...

Comparing 2008 to 2007, the number of new anti-dumping investigations opened in 2008 was up 31%, while the number of anti-dumping measures actually applied increased by 19%. Developing countries dominated this trend on both sides; they initiated 73% of all new investigations and were the target of 78% of them.

But the simplest of all reforms requires minimal legal changes for the EU. Its antidumping law, differently from many others (e.g., the US antidumping law), already includes a 'public interest clause' by which antidumping measures should only be imposed if they are in the interest of the EU community at large.
