Wedding outfit: This red cotton velvet jacket (xiao'ao) was purchased in March 1977 by a 26-year-old actor for her wedding dress. It was worn with blue trousers and black leather shoes. The jacket was made by the Cultural Revolution Clothing Factory in Peking, though the Cultural Revolution had ended.

Sun Yat-sen (Sun Zhongshan) (1866-1925), the Provisional President of the new Chinese Republic proclaimed in 1911, is credited with the modernisation of Chinese men's dress. It is said that he instructed Huang Longsheng, a Western-style tailor from Zhejiang Province, to design a suit based on one commonly worn by Chinese men in Japan and south-east Asia.
